

Subject: Syphilis testing changes.

- The State Hygienic Laboratory will begin using the reverse syphilis serology testing algorithm instead of the traditional algorithm.
- The Serology test request form is changing to reflect the reverse syphilis testing algorithm.
- A new Treponema pallidum antibody test for syphilis will be the screening test in the
 reverse syphilis testing algorithm. The test method will be Chemiluminescent
 Immunoassay (CLIA) performed on the DiaSorin Liaison instrument with a qualitative
 result. Positive treponemal antibody screening tests will be confirmed by the VDRL test.
 Discordant results will be followed with a second treponemal test (TP-PA).

Reverse syphilis testing algorithm:



a. Perform a quantitative nontreponemal test to determine the end-point titer. b. The second treponemal test should utilize a unique platform and/or antigen, different than the first treponemal test, commonly a TP-PA is used at this step. Other publications have tables comparing platforms and antigens in treponemal tests.^{3,8,11} c. Clinical correlation, including past titer(s), is necessary to determine whether the infection is past, cureent or potentially early. d. This result could represent an early infection if the first treponemal immunoassay is more sensitive OR false positivity from the first treponemal test.
